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Dear Readers,





Climate Change³

The Problem

The world is getting warmer. Every year, countries have new **record-breaking⁴** high temperatures. Over time, this can be very dangerous for the planet.

What can we do?

Climate change is a big problem, but everyone can help. Every time you choose something, you can think about how it helps or hurts the earth. You can think about "being green"^{*}, for example, when buying clothes, choosing what to eat, or using electricity.



Too Much Rubbish^{*}

The Problem

When you throw something into the **rubbish bin⁵**, where does it go? Sadly, one place it can go is into the ocean. There is so much rubbish in the Pacific Ocean that it has a name: the Great Pacific Garbage Patch⁶.

What can we do?

The best thing we can do is make less rubbish. One way is to not buy new things that we don't need. Another is to go to shops that use little or no **packaging⁷**. Recycling^{*} can help, but making less rubbish is even better.



What We Eat

The Problem

Many farms **raise⁸** animals for people to eat. These make a lot of **greenhouse gases⁹** that are bad for the planet, and farmers cut down a lot of trees to make the farms. Also, eating food that is from far away means it has to travel on planes, ships, or trucks to get to your dinner table.

What Can We Do?

The two most important things you can do are to eat less meat and more local food. You don't have to be 100% vegan^{*} tomorrow. Some people try Meatless^{*} Mondays or Veganuary (being vegan – eating no meat or animal products – in January) and they still eat meat sometimes.

Environment²

Earth-Friendly Clothes

People often think about water, rubbish, or electricity on Earth Day, but sometimes they forget about **fashion**¹⁰. The clothes that we buy and wear are part of the planet, too. Journalist Dana Thomas wrote a book called *Fashionopolis* about fashion and the environment. She has three ideas about eco-friendly* fashion:

- 1 Buy less.
- 2 Keep things longer.
- 3 Know which clothing companies care about the planet.





Did You Know?

- ▶ There are 62 national parks in the United States. The largest national park, called Yellowstone, is 8,991 km² and goes across three states: Wyoming, Idaho and Montana.
- ▶ Would you like to drive from New York City in the northeast to Los Angeles in the southwest? It will **take**¹² about 42 hours in the car. It takes between 4 and 5 hours to fly between the two cities.
- ▶ Fast food is very popular in the United States. Americans eat around 50 **billion**¹³ hamburgers, 20 billion hot dogs and about 3 billion pizzas per year. About 5% of the population (and around 8% of young people) in the US are vegetarian.

About the United States

Compared to⁷ most of the world, the United States is a young country. **Indigenous**⁸ Americans lived on the land for hundreds of years before 1776, when the United States became a country. Lots of buildings in Europe are older than this country! There are lots of different people from around the world in the US. Each **region**⁹ has its own culture and **personality**¹⁰. For example, life on the West **Coast**¹¹, on the East Coast, in Middle America*, and in the South are all very different.

I'm not really **bald**². It's easy to see that there are white **feathers**³ on my head. So why am I called a bald eagle? That's because a long time ago the word bald also meant white. So I'm really a white eagle. But that's wrong, too. I'm not all white. I'm mostly dark brown.

My body is up to one metre long. My **wingspan**⁴ is more than two metres. What's your wingspan? The feathers on my body are dark brown and white. My wings are dark brown. I have a yellow **beak**⁵ and **talons**⁶. I'm beautiful.

My talons are strong so I can pick up food. I fly over 3,000 metres high in the sky. I have excellent eyes. I can see food over 1.5 kilometres away. When I see my dinner I fly down on it very quickly. I go over 150 kph. Can you fly that fast? My talons pick up my food and I fly to my nest. I like to eat at home.

My nests are really big. Some of them are almost four metres deep. They can

be around two metres **wide**⁷. I like a big house. I live in very high trees or on tops of mountains.

Bald eagles usually have two eggs at one time. Baby eagles are called eaglets. When they are 10–12 weeks old they learn to fly.

I eat small animals. My favourite foods are fish, rabbit and **racoon**⁸. I love meat.

Nothing wants to eat me. I am on top of the **food chain**⁹. I think that's great. Where are you on the food chain?

I live almost everywhere in North America. My favourite place to live is Alaska. I can live up to 35 years. I was **endangered**¹⁰ but now I'm not. It is against the **law**¹¹ to **kill**¹² me. I like that law.
